Environmental restoration at the Dow Wetland Preserve, Antioch

Middle and High School students can help restore wildlife habitat at a freshwater pond at the Dow Wetland Preserve in Antioch. The 500-acre preserve provides important habitat for over 130 bird species, beavers, and other critters in the midst of an urban area. Volunteers plant several species of native grasses and other plants every week on Fridays, Spring and Fall 2006.

Requirements: Ability to work outdoors and use gardening tools, sometimes in inclement weather. Boots, gloves, tools and raingear are provided. UC Berkeley Environmental Sciences Teaching Program leads the field days.
